- Draw your site:**
 - Property lines
 - Sidewalks along edge of property
 - Required setbacks for plantings, structures, and other items from the property line
- Draw all existing and proposed:**
 - Structures
 - Fences or other features
 - Driveways or other vehicle access locations
 - Water access
 - Rain catchment systems or rain gardens
 - Trees
 - Storage
 - Compost, brush and/or trash storage
 - Temporary restrooms and screening
 - Benches and sculptures or other art elements
 - Paths
- Draw in the areas where you will have:**
 - Row crops/planting areas
 - Raised beds
- Label all existing and/or proposed:**
 - Seed banking, permaculture techniques and pollinator habitat
 - Streets and alleys next to the property
 - Fences with heights and materials
 - Dimensions and area of

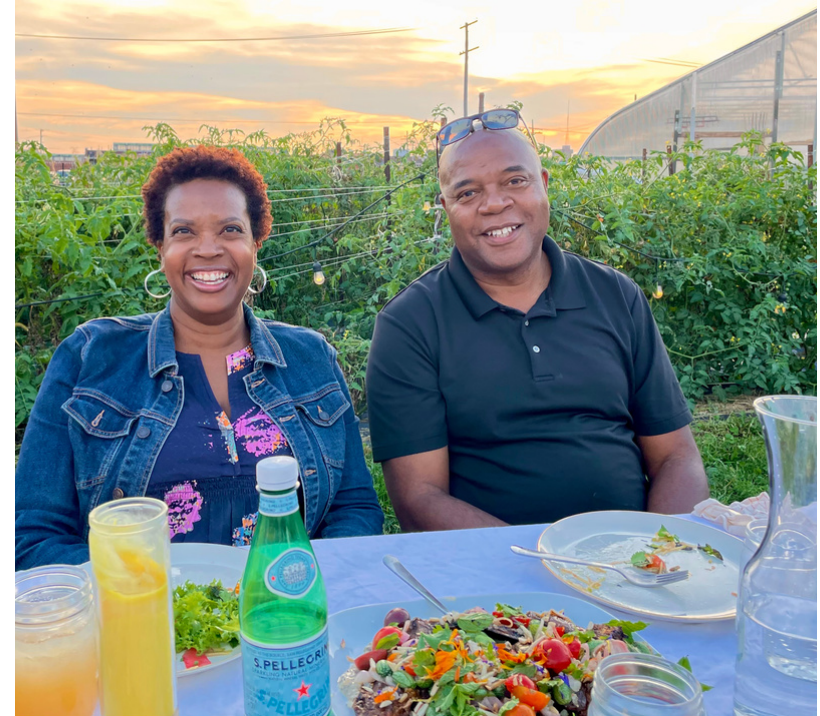
